Maybe they are the remains of pupal cases??

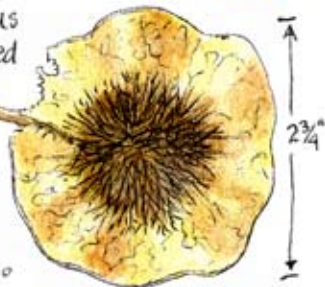


At first glance I thought I'd found a rhino horn - dah!

the hairs in the center are stiff but not prickly.



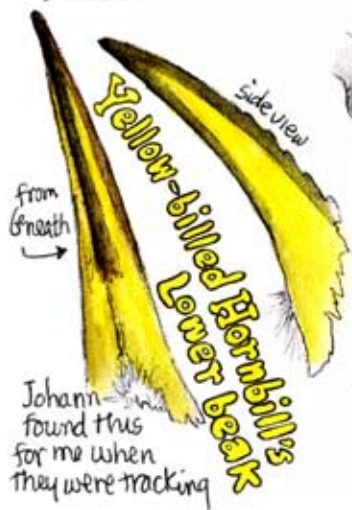
## Nest of an African Paradise-flycatcher



This little nest, with its bowl barely 2" across and decorated with bits of lichen, fell from its tree when the branch broke off. I haven't seen the bird itself, but the female has a much shorter tail. It's a very sturdy nest, tightly woven and glued together with saliva, at a guess, and was built in a thorn bush. There are also spider webs binding it.



I found this nest near one of the waterholes during our white rhino trailing session. Colin identified it for me.
